

He shared his expertise in conservation and highlighted the best practices, techniques, and the latest innovations in paper conservation.

The chief guest of the valedictory session, Padma Shri Prof. Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman, former Treasurer, AMU, and Director, Ibn Sina Academy, stressed the need for deputing skilled conservationists at libraries and museums who are well versed in modern techniques of paper conservation. He lamented the ignorance of the common people of India towards museums compared to European countries and urged the students of museology to work of creating awareness among people about the importance of museums and articles of archival significance.

The guest of honour, Prof. Nafees Ahmad Khan, Dean, Faculty of Life Sciences, underscored the significance of preserving paper-based heritage materials such as manuscripts, rare books, and artworks, which are essential components of history and culture.

Another guest of honour, Mr. S.M. Athar, Joint Registrar, AMU appreciated the efforts made by the Department of Museology in creating awareness among students about culture and history.

Earlier, welcoming the guests and participants, Prof. Abduraheem K., Chairman, Department of Museology, said that the objective of the workshop was to provide participants with practical skills and hands-on experience, focusing on the significance of heritage materials that are vulnerable to deterioration due to factors such as ageing, environmental conditions, pests, and mishandling.

Zainab Iftikhar, a research scholar from the Department of Museology, who has been appointed as Scientist C at the National Museum of Natural History (NMNH), under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, was felicitated on this occasion, along with Dr. Nooruddin Ansari.

A prize distribution ceremony was also held on this occasion to felicitate the winners of the essay writing competition, organised by the Department of Museology on International Museum Day (May 18, 2024), who wrote their essays on "Museums for Education and Research" and won various prizes for their write ups among 50 participants from different schools of Aligarh.

In the senior category (XI and XII), the first prize was given to Sarah Athar (Class XII), Senior Secondary School (Girls), AMU, while the second prize went to Lavi Yadav (Class XII), Heritage International School, and the third prize to Hamid Abbas (Class XII), M.U. College. My thoughts on Friends of Researchers in the Indian Subcontinent (FRIS) – By Syed Ziaur Rahman

During my recent visit to London, the Secretary of AMU Alumni Association of UK. Mr. Khursheed Hasan, fixed a meeting with Dr. Ahmad Waseem, Professor Molecular and Cellular Oral Biology at Blizard Institute, Queen Mary University of London. Dr. Fahim Halim Khan and Dr. Sumbul Halim Khan from Aligarh, also attended the meeting. We were graciously hosted by Prof. Waseem, who first of all congratulated me on becoming a Fellow of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Medicine of the Royal College of Physicians and then gave us a tour of his prestigious institute.

Our meeting was both enjoyable and insightful as we discussed scientific advancements in both London and Aligarh. Dr. Waseem introduced me to Friends of Researchers in the Indian Subcontinent (FRIS), a charitable organization that he founded. FRIS aims to foster collaboration among researchers from the UK, EU countries, and seven countries in the Indian subcontinent including India, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, Nepal. Pakistan and Sri Lanka. The organization's mission is to advance biomedical education and research collaboration to combat diseases and promote global health as well as to equip researchers with the skills and resources needed to contribute effectively to improving health outcomes in the subcontinent and beyond.

FRIS supports initiatives such as researcher exchanges, provides access to modern research tools, facilitates lectures, seminars, webinars, and conferences, and funds research projects in the UK/EU led by scholars from the subcontinent. These efforts are crucial for addressing healthcare needs in the region and promoting disease prevention management through innovative biomedical research. Given the foundational role of biomedical sciences in modern medicine, **FRIS** emphasizes non-clinical and translational research that bridges basic with clinical applications. supporting such research, FRIS aims to equip researchers in the subcontinent with the skills resources necessary to meaningfully to global health challenges.

Although FRIS is currently not accepting grant applications as it establishes itself, I encourage everyone to support its mission. Together, we can contribute to a healthier world by fostering advancements in biomedical education and research through FRIS.

Prof. Syed Ziaur Rahman served as a resource person for the 12th induction-cum training programme on 30 July 2024, held for the New Medical Device Adverse Event Monitoring Centres, established throughout the country under the Materiovigilance Programme of India (MvPI).

The Materiovigilance program is a national initiative launched by the Government of India under the aegis of Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, to ensure the safe and effective use of medical devices in the country. As part of this program, new medical device monitoring centres are being established across India to monitor and regulate the use of medical The Induction Program devices. Materiovigilance is designed to equip these new centres with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively monitor and regulate medical devices.

Seminar held on "Voice of Medicine vs. Voice of Lifeworld Communication"

The seminar also featured a short video on empathy, titled "The Human Connection to Patient Care," which reinforced the importance of compassionate communication in medical practice.

The Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. It was established on 30 March 1978; however, it started functioning in January 1979. Since inception, the Council has been busy in researching various fundamental and applied aspects of Unani Medicine. Over the years, the CCRUM has emerged as the world-leader in the field of research in Unani Medicine.

THE NETWORK

The CCRUM has 23 research centers functioning in different parts of the country, besides its headquarters in New Delhi.

AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

- Clinical Research
- Drug Standardization
- Literary Research
- Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Clinical Research

Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

- Collected over 104,568 specimens of medicinal plants belonging to 1,800 species from the wild.
- Undertaken successful cultivation of 33 important medicinal species.
- Gathered and documented over 16,261 folk medicinal claims.

Literary Research

- Translated 56 volumes of 21 classical books/manuscripts from Arabic/Persian into Urdu and other languages.
- Prepared a database of 2,400 manuscripts of Unani Medicine.
- Reprinted over 70 rare classical books.
- Compiled Standard Unani Medical Terminology for 4,028 terms of Unani Medicine.
- Developed 'Standard Unani Treatment Guidelines for Common Diseases'.

Publications

Produced over 2,000 research papers and brought out about 400 publications, besides regular publication of a
quarterly bulletin CCRUM Newsletter, quarterly Urdu Journal Jahan-e-Tib and quarterly English Journal
Hippocratic Journal of Unani Medicine.
